MEASLES, MUMPS AND RUBELLA VACCINATION

To support the families to access the Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR) immunisation, if your child missed it in school, they can get the MMR immunisation from their GP or by booking an appointment at one of the school aged immunisation team clinics which will be running over Easter. The number of young people catching measles has risen. It's never too late to be vaccinated. You need two doses of MMR one month apart to be fully protected against measles, mumps and rubella.

It's time to make measles a disease of the past.

If you have symptoms of measles, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. STAY AWAY from GP surgeries and A&E departments - you could spread the illness to others.

Measles symptoms include: high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms.
