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Attendance and Punctuality



In order for children to be successful learners, it is very important that they are at school and on time EVERY day. Regularly missing days at school and arriving late creates gaps in children's learning and can impact on their academic success, friendships and well-being. Children should only be absent from school if they are too unwell to attend. Our current school attendance is 92.15% which is below our school target of 97%.

This week alone, more than 25 children arrived late to school and missed vital minutes of important learning time. These late arrivals also created unnecessary work for our office and classroom staff.
